An \$8 chance when the starter sent the field on their journey the four year old mare Not So Chunky, from the Racer's Edge mare Racer's Belle, led all the way and gave her sire Blevic the first leg of a double.

Not So Chunky beat the apprentice Scott Westover mount, the John Croucher trained Dark Knight \$5. Apprentice Elly Brooks who was having her first day back since sustaining head injuries in a track accident last May was another two and a half lengths away third on Snapertude \$12 for Barbara Geracitano.

A \$20,000 purchase at the Adelaide Magic Millions yearling sale in 2009 the three year old Southern Image sired Image Master \$12 gave trainer Kirsten McGowan and jockey Dominic Tourneur a two length win in the 1200 metre second race.

From the Belong to Me matron Elite, Image Master led throughout and beat the John Hyam prepared Paul Gatt mount Finnis Latte \$4 who finished a length ahead of My Ex Mate \$12 for Peter Blanch and apprentice Amy Herrmann.

When asked what were the future plans for Image Master Kirsten McGowan said that the gelding will step up through the grades.

Recording his first win from eight starts Aurumcert, for mentor John Croucher and jockey Jeffrey Maund, was the two length victor of the 1350 metre seventh race.

A \$10 chance at barrier rise the Undoubtedly fathered Aurumcert \$10, from the Geiger Counter mare Auri, came from well back to beat the Tony McEvoy cared for Chad Lever mount You Owe Us \$4.80.

Weekend Disciples \$15 was another two and three quarter lengths away third for Richard Jolly and Libby Hopwood.

The Testa Rossa gelding Test Century \$13, from the Century mare Jolimont, gave trainer Mark Minervini and apprentice Jackson Matthews a long neck win in the final event of 1200 metres.

Coming from well back Test Century beat the Ricky Moore charge, the Dominic Tourneur steered Wanaka Gold \$11.

Bianium \$5.50 was a farther three quarters of a length away third for David Jolly and Simon Price.
